"Feelings of uselessness and self pity will disappear" - The Promises

When I first began attending SAA meetings and working the program, I was lucky to experience long periods of sobriety right from the start. But alas, a few years in, I suffered a terrible relapse. I kept going to meetings during this period, but I also kept myself isolated. When I finally recommitted to my sobriety, I found the withdrawal symptoms that I experienced after my relapse were extreme. Way worse than when I first came in to the rooms. Feelings of uselessness and self pity overtook me. I found that I needed meetings all the time. One evening, on my way home from a meeting (probably already my second that day), I started to feel the desperate anxieties I associated with my withdrawal symptoms. Remembering there was going to be an intergroup meeting that night, I decided to attend, not because I had any desire to do service, but because I needed the comfort and safety of being in a room (any room) full of fellow recovering addicts. Attending intergroup was one way that I could stay closer to the program - and I needed to stay closer to the program. I started ramping up my service work not because I wanted to help you, but because I was desperate to help me. I took on the position of intergroup rep at one meeting, the position of treasurer at another meeting, not out of a sense of duty to those meetings but as a way to focus on something other than my addictive thoughts. I jumped on board to help a fellow member who was starting up a meeting on an evening that there had been no meeting previously - my motives were not altruistic, that was the only evening that there was no meeting, and I needed a meeting every night. I kept going to intergroup as well, not out of a sense of duty but out of a sense of need.

Within a few months of that first intergroup meeting I attended, the one year terms for service positions came up. I took on the position of intergroup chair and the responsibility of being a delegate to the annual conference. It was at that conference, about 9 months after I started committing to service work and about 18 months since I had recommitted to sobriety, that I looked up from my delegates package and noticed that not only had my withdrawal symptoms disappeared, but I actually felt useful!

By my rough calculation, after 8 years in SAA, I think I have attended over two thousand meetings. I still keep up my service work but the best part of it for me is that feeling useful is not just confined to my work in the program. Feeling useful has now grown in to all areas of my life outside the program as well.

Doing service work helps me to experience the promises coming true in my life.

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF TRUSTED SERVICE POSITIONS FOR GVSAA

CHAIR/DELEGATE

ROLE & RESPONSIBILITIES

Chair:

- 1. Leading the meeting for the GVSAA Intergroup;
- 2. Calling special meetings when he/she deems circumstances warrant it;

Delegate:

- 1. Attend the annual ISO of SAA convention and represent views and interests of the GVSAA Intergroup and its participating member groups;
- 2. Report back on the annual ISO of SAA convention to all participating groups by attending each meeting who extends an invitation;

TREASURER

ROLE & RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Collecting donations to the Intergroup from local member groups and individuals and making timely deposits;
- 2. Keeping accounts -- records of income and expenditures;
- 3. Writing checks for monthly expenses;

SECRETARY

ROLE & RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Recording the minutes of each Intergroup meeting;
- 2. Preparing and distributing readable copies of these minutes to group representatives.

LITERATURE REPRESENTATIVE

ROLE & RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Maintaining stock and arranging sale of GVSAA Intergroup approved literature and chips to local SAA groups;
- 2. Keeping accounts records of income and expenditures;

TELEPHONE REPRESENTATIVE

ROLE & RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Administer updates and changes to the phone line messaging system
- 2. Delegate the checking of phone messages and possible call backs as a service position to an SAA member

INTERNET REPRESENTATIVE

ROLE & RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Maintaining and updating website as required (approximately twice a month);
- 2. Familiar with ftp, domain registration/renewal, email list management, email account management;
- 3. Familiar with HTML;
- 4. Comfortable with receiving sexually themed junk e-mail.

WOMEN'S REPRESENTATIVE

ROLE & RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Be the designated contact for telephone, mail and email messages from women seeking recovery and respond as appropriate.

MAILBOX REPRESENTATIVE

ROLE & RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Check the Intergroup mailbox at the downtown post office prior to Intergroup meeting;
- 2. Distribute incoming mail at the monthly Intergroup meeting.

ROLE & RESPONSIBILITIES
